## Submission Guidelines:

- Research must have been conducted primarily by a graduate student. Other individuals may be co-authors; however, the primary author needs to be a graduate student (Master's or Ph. D.).
- Manuscripts should not be previously published in peer-reviewed literature or be under consideration for publication in any other peer-reviewed journal or book, including in another language.
- Manuscripts should be 7000 words maximum (without references, and appendixes).
- Manuscripts should follow the formatting guidelines found <u>here</u> and the APA 7<sup>th</sup> Edition Publication Standards.

## Important Dates:

- Paper submission window: September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.
- Papers will be reviewed on a rolling basis as they are submitted.
- Accepted papers will be published on June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

A <u>Best-Paper Award</u> will be granted to the best manuscript according to the following criteria:

- Report original research and add significantly to the literature.
- Be of interest to the Education Community.
- Have sound motivation and purpose.
- Be scientifically rigorous.

A Certificate of Best Paper will be given.
